

**PD Dr. Andrea Kindler-Röhrborn** studied medicine in Münster and Göttingen. After performing work on basic aspects of carcinogenesis at the Institute of Cell Biology in Essen she spent a fellowship in cancer genetics at the Ludwig Institute for Cancer Research, San Diego, USA. Back in Essen and later at the Institute of Neuropathology in Bonn she started to work on the genetic basis of cancer resistance and susceptibility using model organisms and discovered that variants of different genes determine cancer risk in males and females. Currently she is heading the research group “Molecular Cancer Prevention Research “at the Institute of Pathology, University Hospital of Essen. Her research focuses on the genetics and molecular pathophysiology of sex differences in cancer risk.

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
